Complaints have been received regarding the dust on the road exiting Dene Quarry. Members were advised that the Tarmac sweeper is working 3 hours per day. It was reported that the Tarmac wheel wash is dirty & not cleaning properly.

Mr Bradshaw reported that £5,000 worth of fencing is to be put around the footpaths. Tonnage has increased from 24,000 to 35,000 per month. An extra effort is being made to ensure all lorries are sheeted. Work is to be carried out by the wheelwash.
